<i>Tops and Bottoms</i>	Janet Stevens	Folktale	Once upon a time, there was a lazy Bear and a clever Hare. Bear had lots of money and lots of land but all he wanted to do was sleep. Hare had nothing but hungry children, so he came up with a plan to convince Bear to split his land down the middle—tops and bottoms. Hare can work all day and Bear can sleep. It's the perfect solution! Or is it?
<i>The Tale of Peter Rabbit</i>	Beatrix Potter	Fiction	This classic tale follows mischievous and disobedient young Peter Rabbit as he gets into, and is chased around, the garden of Mr. McGregor.
<i>Fancy Nancy, My Family History</i>	Jane O'Connor	Fiction	When Nancy has to write a report on her ancestors for school, she can't help exaggerating a little—at first. After all, what's wrong with making her family history sound fancier? But Nancy goes too far and has to deal with truth and consequences!

<i>Wagon Wheels</i>	Barbara Brenner	Fiction	The Muldie boys and their father have come a long way to Kansas. But when Daddy moves on, the three boys must begin their own journey. They must learn to care for one another and face the dangers of the wilderness alone.
